

Chief Warrant Officer Five Bernard L. Satterfield
Regimental Chief Warrant Officer – Ordnance Corps

Chief Warrant Officer Bernard Satterfield entered active duty in September 1973. He served in various mechanical maintenance positions supporting an array of Army units including tours in Germany, Korea, Panama, South West Asia, and posts across the United States.

In 1984, CW5 Satterfield was appointed to the Warrant Officer Corps. His first assignment was with the Sergeant York Test Battery at Fort Bliss, Texas, where he served as Battery Maintenance Technician. Next, he was assigned to the 233d Transportation Company (Heavy Equipment Transport) as the Unit Maintenance Technician.

From 1987 to 1990, he served in the Republic of Panama with the 1/228th Aviation Regiment as Battalion Maintenance Officer including Operation Just Cause. He then reported to Fort Bragg, North Carolina from 1990 to 1994, serving in the 37th Engineer Battalion, (Combat) (Airborne) as Intermediate Direct Support Platoon Shop Officer deploying to Operations Desert Shield/Storm.

He then served in the Republic of South Korea from 1994 to 1995, as Maintenance Officer, 4th Chemical Company, 2d Infantry Division, before returning to Fort Bragg and the 1st COSCOM as DS Maintenance Officer, 503d Maintenance Company, from 1995 to 1998.

From 1998 to 1999, CW5 Served as the Contracting Officer Representative for APS-5 Brigade set, ARCENT-FWD, Camp Doha, Kuwait. After returning from Kuwait, was assigned as Brigade Maintenance Officer, 4/78th Training Support Brigade, (AC/RC) supporting the 30th Enhanced Heavy Separate Brigade, in the North Carolina National Guard from 1999 to 2002. He then served with United States Army Special Operations Command, Office of the Inspector General, from 2002 to 2004. He returned to the Republic of South Korea from 2004 to 2005 as the Senior Maintenance Advisor, 2ID DISCOM. CW5 Satterfield was then assigned to Fort Bragg XVIII Airborne Corps as G4 Maintenance Readiness Officer from 2005 to 2006. From 2007 to 2008 he was assigned to the newly transformed 1st Sustainment Command (Theater) with duties as Senior Ordnance Logistics Officer deployed to Camp Arifjan, Kuwait. Prior to appointment as the Regimental Chief Warrant Officer in June 2010, CW5 Satterfield was the Brigade Logistic Support Team Chief (BLST) supporting the 1/82d Advise and Assist Brigade (AAB) deployed to Al Asad Air Base in the Al Anbar Province of Western Iraq.

CW5 Satterfield's military education includes the Logistic Management Development Course, Inspector General's Course, certified Acquisition Life Cycle Logistics (Level I), and the Contracting Officer's Representative Course. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Management from University of Maryland and a Master's degree in Public Administration from Webster University.

Military awards and decorations include the Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Arms Forces Expeditionary Medal, Southwest Asia Service Medal, Iraqi Campaign Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Korea Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Service Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal, NCO Development Ribbon, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Ribbon, Kuwait Liberation Medal (SA), Kuwait Liberation Medal (KU), Army Superior Unit Award, the Parachutist Badge and the German and Belgium Airborne Proficiency Badges.

He is the recipient of the Ordnance Order of Samuel Sharp and an active life member of the U.S Army Ordnance Corps Association, the U.S. Army Warrant Officer Association Bragg Silver Chapter, the Veterans of Foreign Wars and Disabled American Veterans.
