



## **Web Site Holds Reserve Warrants' Information**

A new web site for Army Reserve warrant officers is being developed that will allow warrants to stay connected, exchange ideas and seek mentorship.

The Army Reserve Warrant Officer Mentorship website will encompass information already available to warrants on the Army Reserve web site and more, said Warrant Officer 1 Joseph Provost.

Provost, a civilian network engineer for Ciber Technologies in Rochester, N.Y., is leading up the web site's creation.

"We're looking for a place to put a repository of information," Provost said. Reserve warrant officers will be able to share information about the corps and learn more about their occupational specialty through the site.

But initially the site will help reserve warrant officer candidate school applicants put together their admission packages, a process "which is quite lengthy," Provost, a member of the U.S. Coast Guard before becoming an Army warrant officer, said.

He said a resource is needed for those telling themselves: "I want to be a warrant officer, so what do I need to do?"

Adding, "I didn't have a library to say, 'Oh, this is what it's all about.'"

Provost said the site should be launched sometime next year.

"It is something we definitely need to do now," he said.
