Chief Warrant Officer Five Moore has over 30 years in military food service operations. He is currently assigned to the Combined Arms Support Command (CASCOM) Fort Lee, as the Senior Chief Warrant Officer and Training with Industry Program Manager for Quartermaster/Ordnance/Transportation Officer, Warrant Officer and Noncommissioned Officers. CW5 Moore is a native of Honolulu, Hawaii and joined the Army in July 1975. He reported to Fort Ord, California as a member of the “All-Hawaii Platoon”, to attend Basic and Advanced Individual Training in MOS 94B. In his first assignment, he was assigned to the 1/46th Infantry Battalion, 1st Armored Division in Erlangen, Germany where he served as a food service specialist.

CW5 Moore was directly appointed from Staff Sergeant to Warrant Officer in June 1982. Since then, he has served in a variety of field and staff assignments that include: Food Advisor, 11th Signal Brigade, Fort Huachuca, Arizona; Food Advisor, Task Force Bravo in Honduras and Belize, Central America; Task Force Food Advisor for Operations Bold Eagle, Gallant Eagle, Brim Frost, and Roving Sands; Food Advisor, 45th Corps Support Group, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii; Task Force Food Advisor for Operations Team Spirit, Pacific Glance, and Yama Sakura; Division Food Advisor, 24th Infantry Division (Mech), Fort Stewart, Georgia, (Operation Desert Shield/Storm); Division Food Advisor, 25th Infantry Division (Light), Schofield Barracks, Hawaii; Culinary Program Manager, Executive Officer-Training Directorate, Philip A. Connelly Evaluator, and Chief Food Management Division, Fort Lee; Food Advisor, Comanche Base, Tuzla, Bosnia (Operation Joint Endeavor); Command Food Advisor, United States Forces Korea; and Division Food Advisor, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault), Fort Campbell, Kentucky, (Operation Iraqi Freedom One).

He has served as the Team Administrator to the 1992 All-Army Culinary Olympic Team and was the American Military Representative on the International Military Culinary Committee; the first American Military to represent the United States on the culinary committee of the World Association of Cooks Society; Assistant Culinary Judge at the 1994 Culinary World Cup in Luxemburg, and Team Captain of the 1996 All-Army-Armed Forces Culinary Olympic Team. He is a Certified Chef de Cuisine from the American Culinary Federation and a Certified Food Executive from the International Food Service Executives Association. He also has a degree in Food Technology with Austin Peay State University, Clarksville Tennessee.

CW5 Moore’s military schooling includes the Food Service Supervisor’s Course, Contracting Officers Representative Course, Food Advisor-Technician Course, United States Department of Agriculture Quality Assurance Course, Warrant Officer Advance Course, Air Assault Course, Total Army Instructor Course, Warrant Officer Senior Course and the Warrant Officer Senior Staff Course.

He is authorized to wear two Bronze Star Medals, ten Meritorious Service Medals, three Army Commendation Medals, Army Achievement Medal, Southwest Asia Medal with two bronze stars, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Korean Defense Service Medal, NATO Medal (Bosnia), Iraq Campaign Medal, Saudi and Kuwaiti Liberation Medals, Meritorious Unit Citation, Army Superior Unit Award and the Joint Meritorious Unit Award.
